

Kazakhstan Mission

Demetri and Michelle shared about the changes in their mission work to Kazakhstan due to family needs. This year, whilst residing in Brisbane, Demetri will travel regularly to Kazakhstan to continue to develop, strengthen and train the now indigenous leadership of their church and outreach centre. We were able to contribute \$1,065 of donations on the day, with an additional \$60 per month. If you wish to assist them regularly please let Jim Smith our treasurer know.

Great Team - 2015

Some annual meetings, followed by annual reports to the Diocese, are tedious and boring. However, St Jude's Annual General Meeting was a great time of appreciation for the efforts of our leaders and team members during 2015. The Rectors and Wardens Reports revealed not only the extensive activities of our church, but also the great number of leaders and team members participating in the ministry of our church in 2015. The annual returns noted that over 60% of our members were involved in some form of ministry or service in and through our Church. St Jude's Education and Christian Training Fund No. 2's report showed that the number of volunteers involved in the creation of resources and the delivering of training and education for our church in 2015 had grown from 26 to 32 .

The meeting itself began with the draw for sumptuous door prizes ranging from boxes of Dairy Milk chocolates to muesli bars. The reports showed that 2015 was a tremendous year, with a shift in focus from building the new Church to building up our congregations. The Wardens and Ps Andrew thanked those who contributed to the life of our church in a myriad of ways. The financial report showed that we had good year.

The budget for 2016 aims to move us from maintenance to mission mode in a number of areas of our church's life and ministry as identified from the LYCIG program last year. This gives us some hurdles to overcome, but it was noted that we have had those type of hurdles before and through faith and the gracious giving of our members we have met the ministry and building needs of our church's life. It was also noted again that *building loan repayments of \$2360 per month* need to come from our Building Appeal rather than our ministry fund..
